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PREFACE

The Idaho Administrative Bulletin is an electronic-only, online monthly publication of the Office of the Administrative Rules Coordinator, Division of Financial Management, that is published pursuant to Section 67-5203, Idaho Code. The Bulletin is a compilation of all official rulemaking notices, official rule text, executive orders of the Governor, and all legislative documents affecting rules that are statutorily required to be published in the Bulletin. It may also include other rules-related documents an agency may want to make public through the Bulletin.

State agencies are required to provide public notice of all rulemaking actions and must invite public input. This is done through negotiated rulemaking procedures or after proposed rulemaking has been initiated. The public receives notice that an agency has initiated proposed rulemaking procedures through the Idaho Administrative Bulletin and a legal notice (Public Notice of Intent) that publishes in authorized newspapers throughout the state. The legal notice provides reasonable opportunity for the public to participate when a proposed rule publishes in the Bulletin. Interested parties may submit written comments to the agency or request public hearings of the agency, if none have been scheduled. Such submissions or requests must be presented to the agency within the time and manner specified in the individual “Notice of Rulemaking - Proposed Rule” for each proposed rule that is published in the Bulletin.

Once the comment period closes, the agency considers fully all comments and information submitted regarding the proposed rule. Changes may be made to the proposed rule at this stage of the rulemaking, but changes must be based on comments received and must be a “logical outgrowth” of the proposed rule. The agency may now adopt and publish the pending rule. A pending rule is “pending” legislative review for final approval. The pending rule is the agency’s final version of the rulemaking that will be forwarded to the legislature for review and final approval. Comment periods and public hearings are not provided for when the agency adopts a temporary or pending rule.

CITATION TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

The Bulletin is identified by the calendar year and issue number. For example, Bulletin **19-1** refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year **2019**; Bulletin **20-1** refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year **2020**. Volume numbers, which proceed from 1 to 12 in a given year, correspond to the months of publication, i.e.; Volume No. **19-1** refers to January 2019; Volume No. **20-2** refers to February 2020; and so forth. Example: The Bulletin published in January 2019 is cited as Volume **19-1**. The December 2019 Bulletin is cited as Volume **19-12**.

RELATIONSHIP TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The **Idaho Administrative Code** is an electronic-only, online compilation of all final and enforceable administrative rules of the state of Idaho that are of full force and effect. Any temporary rule that is adopted by an agency and is of force and effect is codified into the Administrative Code upon Bulletin publication. All pending rules that have been approved by the legislature during the legislative session as final rules and any temporary rules that are extended supplement the Administrative Code. These rules are codified into the Administrative Code upon becoming effective. Because proposed and pending rules are not enforceable, they are published in the Administrative Bulletin only and cannot be codified into the Administrative Code until approved as final.

To determine if a particular rule remains in effect or whether any amendments have been made to the rule, refer to the **Cumulative Rulemaking Index**. Link to it on the Administrative Rules homepage at adminrules.idaho.gov.

THE DIFFERENT RULES PUBLISHED IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Idaho’s administrative rulemaking process, governed by the Administrative Procedure Act, Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code, comprises distinct rulemaking actions: negotiated, proposed, temporary, pending and final rulemaking. Not all rulemakings incorporate or require all of these actions. At a minimum, a rulemaking includes proposed, pending and final rulemaking. Many rules are adopted as temporary rules when they meet the required statutory criteria and agencies must, when feasible, engage in negotiated rulemaking at the beginning of the process to facilitate consensus building. In the majority of cases, the process begins with proposed rulemaking and ends with the final rulemaking. The following is a brief explanation of each type of rule.

1. NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING

Negotiated rulemaking is a process in which all interested persons and the agency seek consensus on the content of a rule through dialogue. Agencies are required to conduct negotiated rulemaking whenever it is feasible to do so. The agency files a “Notice of Intent to Promulgate – Negotiated Rulemaking” for publication in the Administrative Bulletin inviting interested persons to contact the agency if interested in discussing the agency’s intentions regarding the rule changes. This process is intended to result in the formulation of a proposed rule and the initiation of regular rulemaking procedures. One result, however, may also be that regular (proposed) rulemaking is not initiated and no further action is taken by the agency.

2. PROPOSED RULEMAKING

A proposed rulemaking is an action by an agency wherein the agency is proposing to amend or repeal an existing rule or to adopt a new rule. Prior to the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, the agency must publish a “Notice of Rulemaking – Proposed Rule” in the Bulletin. This notice must include very specific information regarding the rulemaking including all relevant state or federal statutory authority occasioning the rulemaking, a non-technical description of the changes being made, any associated costs, guidance on how to participate through submission of written comments and requests for public hearings, and the text of the proposed rule in legislative format.

3. TEMPORARY RULEMAKING

Temporary rules may be adopted only when the governor finds that it is necessary for:

- a) protection of the public health, safety, or welfare; or
- b) compliance with deadlines in amendments to governing law or federal programs; or
- c) conferring a benefit.

If a rulemaking meets one or more of these criteria, and with the Governor’s approval, the agency may adopt and make a temporary rule effective prior to receiving legislative authorization and without allowing for any public input. The law allows an agency to make a temporary rule immediately effective upon adoption. A temporary rule expires at the conclusion of the next succeeding regular legislative session unless the rule is extended by concurrent resolution, is replaced by a final rule, or expires under its own terms.

4. PENDING RULEMAKING

A pending rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under regular rulemaking procedures and remains subject to legislative review before it becomes a final, enforceable rule. When a pending rule is published in the Bulletin, the agency is required to include certain information in the “Notice of Rulemaking – Pending Rule.” This includes a statement giving the reasons for adopting the rule, a statement regarding when the rule becomes effective, a description of how it differs from the proposed rule, and identification of any fees being imposed or changed.

Agencies are required to republish the text of the pending rule when substantive changes have been made to the proposed rule. An agency may adopt a pending rule that varies in content from that which was originally proposed if the subject matter of the rule remains the same, the pending rule change is a logical outgrowth of the proposed rule, and the original notice was written so as to assure that members of the public were reasonably notified of the subject. It is not always necessary to republish all the text of the pending rule.

5. FINAL RULEMAKING

A final rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under the regular rulemaking procedures and is of full force and effect.

HOW TO USE THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Rulemaking documents produced by state agencies and published in the **Idaho Administrative Bulletin** are organized by a numbering schematic. Each state agency has a two-digit identification code number known as the “**IDAPA**” number. (The “IDAPA” Codes are listed in the alphabetical/numerical index at the end of this Preface.) Within each agency there are divisions or sections to which a two-digit “TITLE” number is assigned. There are “CHAPTER” numbers assigned within the Title and the rule text is divided among major sections that are further subdivided into subsections. An example IDAPA number is as follows:

IDAPA 38.05.01.200.02.c.ii.

“**IDAPA**” refers to Administrative Rules in general that are subject to the Administrative Procedures Act and are required by this act to be published in the Idaho Administrative Code and the Idaho Administrative Bulletin.

“**38.**” refers to the Idaho Department of Administration

“**05.**” refers to Title **05**, which is the Department of Administration’s Division of Purchasing

“**01.**” refers to Chapter **01** of Title 05, “Rules of the Division of Purchasing”

“**200.**” refers to Major Section **200**, “Content of the Invitation to Bid”

“**02.**” refers to Subsection 200.02.

“**c.**” refers to Subsection 200.02.c.

“**ii.**” refers to Subsection 200.02.c.ii.

DOCKET NUMBERING SYSTEM

Internally, the Bulletin is organized sequentially using a rule docketing system. Each rulemaking that is filed with the Coordinator is assigned a “DOCKET NUMBER.” The docket number is a series of numbers separated by a hyphen “-”, (**38-0501-1401**). Rulemaking dockets are published sequentially by IDAPA number (the two-digit agency code) in the Bulletin. The following example is a breakdown of a typical rule docket number:

“DOCKET NO. 38-0501-1901”

“**38-**” denotes the agency's **IDAPA** number; in this case the Department of Administration.

“**0501-**” refers to the **TITLE AND CHAPTER** numbers of the agency rule being promulgated; in this case the Division of Purchasing (**TITLE 05**), Rules of the Division of Purchasing (**Chapter 01**).

“**1901**” denotes the year and sequential order of the docket being published; in this case the numbers refer to the first rulemaking action published in **calendar year 2019**. A subsequent rulemaking on this same rule chapter in calendar year 2019 would be designated as “**1902**”. The docket number in this scenario would be 38-0501-**1902**.

Within each Docket, only the affected sections of chapters are printed. (See **Sections Affected Index** in each Bulletin for a listing of these.) The individual sections affected are printed in the Bulletin sequentially (e.g. Section “200” appears before Section “345” and so on). Whenever the sequence of the numbering is broken the following statement will appear:

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-20

CONTINUING THE IDAHO CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the State of Idaho that government promote efficiency and effectiveness of the criminal justice system and, where possible, encourage dialogue among the respective branches of government to achieve this effectiveness and efficiency; and

WHEREAS, combating crime and protecting citizens from criminal depredations is of vital concern to government; and

WHEREAS, communication and cooperation among the various elements of the community of criminal justice professionals is of utmost importance in promoting efficiency and effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, providing policy makers and criminal justice decision makers with accurate information results in better decisions, improving public safety and resulting in more efficient use of public resources; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 and the Crime Control Act of 2005, each state is encouraged to develop and implement a competitive mechanism for awarding certain federal grant funds; and

WHEREAS, Idaho's current criminal justice efforts and initiatives require clear strategic planning and continued coordination; and

WHEREAS, since its creation in 2005, the Idaho Criminal Justice Commission has advised and made recommendations to Idaho Governors on criminal justice policy in forum that brings stakeholders together to respectfully work together.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Idaho do hereby order that Executive Order 2018-03 is repealed and replaced by this order, and in so doing do also order that:

- I. The Idaho Criminal Justice Commission (“Commission”) is hereby established. The Commission shall consist of twenty-seven (27) members and the membership shall be as follows:*
 - a. Ex Officio Members:*
 - i. The Attorney General or designee;*
 - ii. The Director of the Idaho Department of Correction;*
 - iii. The Director of the Idaho State Police;*
 - iv. The Director of the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections;*
 - v. The Administrator of the Office of Drug Policy;*
 - vi. The Executive Director of the Idaho Association of Counties;*
 - vii. The Executive Director of the Idaho Commission of Pardons and Parole;*
 - viii. The Director of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare or designee;*
 - ix. The Administrative Director of the State Courts;*
 - x. The State Appellate Public Defender; and*
 - xi. The United States Attorney for the District of Idaho or designee.*
 - b. Members Appointed by the Governor:*
 - i. A representative from the Governor's Office;*
 - ii. A representative from the Idaho Prosecuting Attorneys Association;*

- iii. *A representative from the Idaho Sheriffs ' Association;*
 - iv. *A representative from the Idaho Chiefs of Police Association;*
 - v. *A representative from the Idaho State Department of Education;*
 - vi. *Three (3) citizens at large, with special consideration given to individuals with experience or education related to the Mission of the Idaho Criminal Justice Commission, and/or those individuals representing tribal or other underrepresented communities in Idaho; and*
 - vii. *A representative serving on the Idaho Public Defense Commission or the Executive Director.*
- c. *Members Appointed by Other Officials:*
- i. *Two (2) members from the Idaho Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore;*
 - ii. *Two (2) members from the Idaho House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; and*
 - iii. *Three (3) representatives from the Idaho judiciary appointed by the Chief Justice, with at least one (1) representative being a district judge and at least one (1) representative being a magistrate judge*
2. *The Commission members representing the judiciary and the United States Attorney for the District of Idaho or designee will serve in a nonvoting, advisory capacity.*
 3. *Any designees authorized by this order must be from the same office or agency as the Commission member. Ex-officio members, unless expressly allowed by this order to select a designees their office or agency, may not allow a designee to vote in their stead.*
 4. *All Commission members appointed by the Governor serve at the pleasure of the Governor and vacancies among Commission members with a term-fixed by this order shall be refilled in the same manner as the original appointment and-for the duration of the unexpired term.*
 5. *The terms of all Commission members appointed by the Governor shall terminate on thirty-first day of January. The terms of all Commission members appointed by the Governor shall be before four (4) years, except the citizens at large, whose terms shall be before two (2) years.*
 6. *The Chair of the Commission shall be appointed by the Governor to serve at the pleasure of the Governor. A Vice-Chair shall be selected annually by the members of the Commission. The term of office of the Vice-Chair shall be one (1) year. The Chair may succeed himself as approved by the Governor and the Vice-Chair may succeed himself as approved by the Commission.*
 7. *The Commission shall receive administrative staff support from the State agencies represented on the Commission.*
 8. *The Commission will meet no less than-four (4) times annually.*
 9. *The Commission may appoint subcommittees consistent with the needs of the Commission to address-pertinent issues that merit more in-depth consideration.*
 10. *Commission members will serve without compensation or reimbursement for expenses, including related travel and per diem to attend Commission meetings.*
 11. *The purpose of the Commission shall be to-provide policy-level direction and to-promote efficient and effective use of resources, based on a data- driven approach and evidenced- based practices, for matters related to the State 's criminal justice system. To that end it shall:*
 - a. *Identify critical challenges facing the criminal justice system and recommend strategies to resolve them by;*
 - b. *Developing and adopting a three-year strategic plan to be reviewed annually;*
 - c. *Analyzing the long-range needs of the criminal justice system;*

- d. *Assessing the cost-effectiveness, return on investment and performance measures of the use of State and local-funds in the criminal justice system;*
 - e. *Reviewing data and reporting relating to Idaho's implementation of the Justice Reinvestment Act subsequent criminal justice reforms;*
 - f. *Advise and develop recommendations for the Governor and the Legislature, when appropriate, nonpublic policy and strategies to improve the State 'criminal justice system;*
 - g. *Review and evaluate criminal justice policies and proposed legislation to determine the impact on the State 'adult and juvenile justice systems;*
 - h. *Promote communication among criminal justice professionals and the respective branches of State and local government to improve professionalism, create partnerships, and improve cooperation and coordination at all levels of the criminal justice system; and*
 - i. *Research and evaluate evidenced-based practices and use-findings to influence decisions on-policy.*
12. *The Grant Review Council ("Council") shall be established under the Commission and is charged with disbursing federal grant funding appropriated under provisions of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, as amended; of the Violence Against Women Act of 1994, and other such federal grant programs as may come within the purview of the Idaho State Police with the overall mission of enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of the criminal justice system in Idaho.*
- a. *The Council shall consist of thirteen (13) members of the Idaho Criminal Justice Commission for the purpose of assisting the Idaho State Police in its distribution of grant funds. The Council membership shall be as follows:*
 - i. *The Attorney General or designee;*
 - ii. *The Administrative Director of the State Courts;*
 - iii. *The Director of the Idaho Department of Correction;*
 - iv. *The Director of the Idaho State Police;*
 - v. *The Director of the Idaho Department of Juvenile Corrections;*
 - vi. *The Administrator of the Office of Drug Policy;*
 - vii. *The Idaho State Appellate Public Defender;*
 - viii. *A representative from the Idaho Prosecuting Attorneys Association;*
 - ix. *The Executive Director of the Idaho Association of Counties;*
 - x. *Two (2) citizens at large;*
 - xi. *A representative from the Idaho Sheriffs 'Association; and*
 - xii. *A representative from the Idaho Chiefs of Police Association.*
 - b. *In addition, the Council shall consist of the following seven (7) members appointed by the Chair of the Commission upon recommendation by the Commission:*
 - i. *A representative from the Idaho Council on Domestic Violence;*
 - ii. *A representative from a statewide advocacy agency;*
 - iii. *A prosecuting attorney;*
 - iv. *A representative from the juvenile justice system;*
 - v. *A representative from the misdemeanor probation system;*
 - vi. *A Chief of Police; and*
 - vii. *A Sheriff.*
 - c. *The Chair of the Council shall be appointed by vote of the members of the Council and shall serve a term of four (4) years. The Chair will report to the Commission not less than annually on the activities, actions, and decisions of the Council regarding the distribution of grant funds.*
 - d. *Each member of the Council shall be entitled to one vote in the matters before them.*

- e. *No member may participate in a vote for a direct award of funds in which the member receives personal pecuniary benefits, as defined by Idaho Code. Unless prohibited by federal grant restriction, when a member has authority over an entity or agency which has applied for a direct award of funds, the member shall disclose the relationship to the Council. Upon disclosure of such relationship, the member may vote upon the award unless the member requests to be excused.*
- f. *Participation by Council members (or their designees, when authorized by this order) in the scoring and evaluation of the individual grant applications is required. Members not participating in the scoring and evaluation process will not be entitled to vote on the awarding of the application.*
- g. *Meetings of the Council shall be convened as determined necessary by the Chair of the Council, Chair of the Commission, or the Idaho State Police.*
- h. *The principal staff functions of the Council shall be located with the Idaho State Police.*
- i. *Members of the Council will receive travel reimbursement in accordance with Idaho State Police policy and procedures.*
- j. *The Council will establish by-laws in accordance with guidance provided by the Bureau of Justice Assistance and the Idaho State Police, and consistent with the Commission's long-term strategies.*
- k. *Members of the Council will receive training provided by the Idaho State Police and in conjunction with the Commission.*
- l. *Members of the Council will meet at least once a year to assist in strategic planning efforts with representatives from the Idaho State Police. The Council shall develop a strategic funding plan consistent with the statewide strategic planning efforts of the Commission.*

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2021-01

TRANSPORTATION OF HEMP

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Improvement Act of 2018 (“2018 Farm Bill”) was signed into law by President Donald J. Trump on December 20, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Agricultural Act of 2014 (“2014 Farm Bill”) previously authorized certain limited hemp research pilot projects; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 Farm Bill provides that state laws regulating the production of hemp that are more stringent than the 2018 Farm Bill are not preempted (7 U.S.C. § 1639p(a)(3)(A)); and

WHEREAS, Idaho law prohibits the possession of hemp unless it is comprised of only the stalks of the mature Cannabis plant and contains 0.0% tetrahydrocannabinol (THC); and

WHEREAS, the 2018 Farm Bill allows for the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to license the production of hemp, as further defined in that law; and

WHEREAS, some western states, including some surrounding the State of Idaho, have instituted a research pilot project under the 2014 Farm Bill or are expected to allow production of hemp pursuant to the 2018 Farm Bill; and

WHEREAS, Section 10114(b) of the 2018 Farm Bill prevents states from prohibiting the transportation or shipment of hemp produced in accordance with Subtitle G of the Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 (as amended by the insertion of Section 10113 of the 2018 Farm Bill); and

WHEREAS, the USDA recently promulgated interim final rules and regulations necessary to license hemp production under the 2018 Farm Bill; and

WHEREAS, Idaho law as currently written will likely conflict with federal law with respect to interstate transportation of hemp permitted by the 2018 Farm Bill now that the USDA interim final rules and regulations on hemp production have been published; and

WHEREAS, executive action is needed to assure that the laws of the State of Idaho are faithfully executed to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of this state from the illicit drug trade; and

WHEREAS, executive action is needed to temporarily resolve the conflict between state and federal law with respect to interstate transportation of hemp until a more permanent solution on interstate transportation and production is enacted by the Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the evolving landscape with respect to hemp necessitates a legal framework that is clear about the expectations of the State of Idaho with respect to the orderly transportation of hemp through our state and that is not overly burdensome on transporters.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the Constitution and the laws of the State of Idaho, do hereby order that Executive Order 2019-13 is repealed and replaced by this Executive Order; and that the State of Idaho permit, on and after October 31, 2019, the interstate transportation of hemp produced in accordance with the 2014 Farm Bill or the 2018 Farm Bill and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder; and in so doing do also order that:

01. Any transporter of hemp shall have the affirmative duty to stop at the first port of entry encountered in the State of Idaho to declare the presence of any hemp.

02. Any transporter of hemp must present at the port of entry:

a. An affirmation from the driver that their vehicle contains no illicit drugs or variations of hemp not explicitly authorized by the 2014 Farm Bill or the 2018 Farm Bill;

b. Verification, including a copy of the hemp production license from the producer of the hemp being transported, that the hemp was produced by a grower or producer duly licensed by a state or Indian Tribe authorized to regulate hemp production under the 2014 Farm Bill or the 2018 Farm Bill;

c. A laboratory results report which confirms each lot of hemp being transported complies with the 2014 Farm Bill or the 2018 Farm Bill, as provided in 7C.F.R. §§990. 70(d) and 990. 71(d), and which was produced by a DEA-registered laboratory; and

d. A bill of lading, containing the shipment contents, origination, including lot number, and destination of the hemp, the weight of the load, and the type of vehicle hauling or transporting the hemp.

3. All receptacles, open or closed, of hemp being transported across Idaho must be labeled with the name and address of the producer, the quantity of the hemp, and the lot number to correspond with the above required documentation.

4. Any transporter of hemp shall consent to inspection of the shipment to ensure that the hemp complies with the 2014 Farm Bill or the 2018 Farm Bill, and shall further consent to randomly selected, reasonable-sized sampling of hemp for further off-sight testing by the Idaho State Police (ISP).

5. Once the hemp inspection is completed at the port of entry or roadside, transporters will be given an inspection report, confirming all required documents were presented and whether or not any samples of the hemp were taken. The inspection report must be presented upon request during any contact with a peace officer, as defined in Section 19-510I, Idaho Code, in the State of Idaho subsequent to the initial declaration at the port of entry or roadside.

6. Any transporters of hemp shall proceed through the State of Idaho avoiding any unnecessary delay because possession of any quantity of hemp other than for the narrow purpose of transporting across the State of Idaho in interstate commerce remains illegal in this state.

7. The Idaho State Department of Agriculture (ISDA), ISP and ITD shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to assure Idaho's compliance with the provisions of this Executive Order. I find that it is necessary that such rules become effective immediately upon adoption for the protection of the public health, safety, and welfare and in order to comply with the recently enacted USDA interim final rules on hemp. The ISDA, ISP, and ITD may contract with one another or any other department as may be necessary to efficiently carry out this Executive Order.

8. Nothing within this Executive Order or the corresponding rules adopted subsequent to this Executive Order shall authorize or be interpreted to legalize hemp, its byproducts, oils, or any other derivative prohibited by Idaho law. This Executive Order only permits the interstate transportation of hemp consistent with the 2018 Farm Bill and implementing regulations, this Executive Order, and the State of Idaho rules regarding the interstate transportation of hemp.

9. Nothing within this Executive Order or the corresponding rules adopted subsequent to this Executive Order shall authorize or be interpreted to apply to hemp transported in the State of Idaho prior to October 31, 2019. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of this Executive Order and the corresponding rules adopted subsequent to this Executive Order, may subject the transporter to the laws prohibiting marijuana under Chapter 27, Title 37, Idaho Code, and any other applicable civil and criminal penalties authorized by law.

EFFECTIVE DATE: A temporary rule was adopted under this docket number in the April 1, 2020, Idaho Administrative Bulletin, [Vol. 20-4, pages 31 through 35](#) with an effective date of March 20, 2020. The effective date of the amendment to the temporary rule is January 7, 2021.

AUTHORITY: In compliance with Section 67-5226, Idaho Code, notice is hereby given that this agency has amended a temporary rule. The action is authorized pursuant to Sections 67-2901, 67-2901A, and 67-2901B, Idaho Code, and the Agricultural Improvement Act of 2018. Pub. Law No. 115-334, 132 Stat. 4490, and the Agricultural Act of 2014. Pub. Law No. 113-79, 128 Stat. 649.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The following is a concise explanatory statement of the reasons for amending the temporary rule and a statement of any change between the text of the temporary rule and the amended text of the temporary rule with an explanation of the reasons for the change:

These changes would amend the existing temporary rule to eliminate a requirement providing that shipments are limited to interstate highways; eliminate subsequent unnecessary definitions; and to reflect a change and update a reference to an executive order #2021-001 issued by Idaho Governor Little which went into effect January 7, 2021. The impact of these changes comply with the Red Tape Reduction act as they reduce regulation on those impacted by the existing rule; are necessary to maintain compliance with various state and federal statutes as well as current legal interpretations, and to meet new guidelines as outlined by Idaho [Executive Order 2021-01](#). As such, these changes must be implemented effective January 7, 2021.

TEMPORARY RULE JUSTIFICATION: Pursuant to Sections 67-5226(1)(a) and (1)(b), Idaho Code, the Governor has found that temporary adoption of the rule is appropriate for the following reasons:

This rule is necessary to provide for compliance in federal statute and to provide for interstate transportation of hemp, as defined and stated in [Executive Order 2021-01](#).

Should the first established or temporary port of entry be closed for operations, the transporter or vehicle must stop at the first available port of entry. (3-20-20)T

02. Required Documentation. Any transporter or vehicle hauling hemp shall carry and provide upon

initial declaration at a port of entry, and upon request during any contact with a peace officer in the State of Idaho, the following documents: (3-20-20)T

Transporters shall not be entitled to compensation for these de minimis samples. (3-20-20)T

06. Shipment Weight. Weight for purposes of enforcement is deemed to be the declared weight on the transporter's bill of lading or the actual weight at time of inspection, whichever is greater. (3-20-20)T

AUTHORITY: As authorized by Section 36-104, Idaho Code, and in compliance with Sections 36-105(3), Idaho Code, the Commission adopts proclamations establishing seasons and limits for hunting, fishing, and trapping in Idaho.

AVAILABILITY OF OFFICIAL PROCLAMATIONS: Hunters, anglers, and trappers are advised to consult the text of the Commission’s official proclamation before hunting, fishing, or trapping. Current versions of Commission proclamations are available on-line at <https://idfg.idaho.gov/rules>, with print versions available at Idaho Department of Fish and Game offices and license vendors.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY AND PUBLIC MEETING SCHEDULE:

The Commission meeting schedule and meeting agendas are available on-line at [Commission Meeting Schedule](#), with opportunities for public comment generally scheduled at its January, March, May, July, and November meetings.

Current/scheduled proclamations of the Commission include:

- **Big Game: elk, deer (mule and white-tailed), mountain lion, black bear, pronghorn, gray wolf**
 - The proclamation adopted by the Commission for 2019-2020 seasons includes black bear, mountain lion seasons through July 2021 and gray wolf seasons through June 2021.
 - 2021-2022 season setting is scheduled for Commission action on March 18, 2021 (public hearing March 17, 2021).
- **Big Game: moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat (once-in-a-lifetime big game species)**
 - On January 28, 2021 (after public hearing on January 27, 2021), the Commission adopted 2021-2022 seasons and limits for moose, bighorn sheep, and mountain goat.
- **Migratory Game Birds**
 - The proclamation adopted by the Commission for 2020-2021 seasons include waterfowl seasons through March 2021. A swan season was adopted separately for the inaugural 2020 season, but will be included along with other waterfowl in 2021 and later year migratory bird proclamations.
 - 2021-2022 season setting is scheduled for Commission action on April 15, 2021 (public hearing March 17, 2021).
- **Upland Game, Furbearer, Falconry, Upland (non-migratory) Game Birds: turkey, pheasant, grouse (except sage grouse), quail, partridge**
 - The proclamation adopted by the Commission for 2020-21 includes upland game bird seasons through January 2022, upland game animal and falconry seasons through March 2022, and furbearer seasons through June 2022.
 - 2022-2023 season setting is scheduled for Commission action at its quarterly meeting in January 2022.
- **Sage Grouse**
 - 2021 season setting is scheduled for Commission Action on August 19, 2021 (public hearing July 14, 2021).
- **Fishing (except for chinook and coho salmon)**
 - The proclamation adopted for 2019-2021 seasons (most recently amended November 20, 2020, with changes for spring 2021 steelhead fishing seasons) includes fishing seasons (except for salmon) through December 31, 2021.
 - 2022-2024 season setting is scheduled for Commission action on November 16, 2021 (public hearing November 15, 2021).

- **Chinook Salmon**
 - Spring/summer chinook salmon season setting is scheduled for Commission action on March 18, 2021 (public hearing March 17, 2021) and May 6, 2021 (public hearing May 5, 2021).
 - 2021 fall chinook salmon season setting is scheduled for Commission action on July 15, 2021 (public hearing July 14, 2021).
- **Coho Salmon**
 - Fall coho salmon 2021 season setting is scheduled for Commission action on July 15, 2021 (public hearing July 14, 2021).
- **Peregrine Falcon Capture (for falconry use)**
 - The proclamation adopted for 2019-2021 peregrine falcon capture seasons included seasons through August 31, 2021.
 - 2022-2025 season setting for peregrine capture is scheduled for the quarterly Commission meeting in March 2022.

As provided in Sections 36-104 and 36-105, Idaho Code, the Commission retains authority to issue proclamations for additional species, amend existing proclamations, and adjust the above schedule as circumstances warrant. As provided in Section 36-106, Idaho Code, the Director has authority to close seasons or reduce bag or possession limits as circumstances may warrant and to open seasons to protect property from wildlife damage or for salvage.

CORRECTION SUMMARY: This notice corrects an error that occurred during the publication of the temporary rule in the April 15, 2020, Special Edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin, [Volume 20-4SE](#), the proposed rule in the September 16, 2020, Special Edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin, [Volume 20-9SE](#), and the pending fee rule in the November 18, 2020, Special Edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin, [Volume 20-11SE](#), published under Docket No. 16-0000-2000F, specifically IDAPA 16.06.02, “Child Care Licensing,” Section 671.

The Idaho Board of Health and Welfare adopted the temporary rule on February 27, 2020, for IDAPA 16.06.02, “Child Care Licensing,” which included Section 671 – Family Home Study, Adoption, Application Process, and Content. c. Unless otherwise directed by the Presiding Officer, public access to space controlled by the Idaho legislature is limited to the Legislative Galleries, Legislative Hearing Rooms, and the conduct of legislative business with a legislator. (1-7-21)T

d. Temporary and permanent placement of Exhibits in the Public Space shall be reviewed by the Capitol Commission in accordance with Section 67-1608(3), Idaho Code. Placement of Exhibits does not include Displays during a Public Use permitted by these rules. (1-7-21)T

02. **Prohibited Uses.** The following uses are prohibited ~~in~~ at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior: ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

a. Commercial Activity. The ~~State Capitol~~ Exterior and the Public Space shall not be used for any activity conducted for profit and no persons shall solicit to sell any merchandise or service on the ~~State Capitol~~ Exterior or in the Public Space. 03. **Priority of Uses.** State Maintenance and Improvements shall have priority over all other use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior. The conduct of business by the public entity or official occupying or controlling Private Space shall have priority over Public Use of the Idaho State Capitol. 202. EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES.

Except as provided in these rules, the Department will not provide equipment or supplies for use on the Idaho State Capitol Exterior. 203. ESTABLISHMENT OF PERIMETERS.

204. AREA CLOSURES.

The Director may direct that any portion of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior be closed for Public Use upon a finding that the closed portion of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior has sustained damage or is in imminent danger of sustaining damage. The closure directive shall identify the portion of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior closed, the damage that has occurred or that will occur without closure, and the estimated period of closure to restore or prevent the damage. A notice of closure and information on how to obtain a copy of the closure directive shall be posted at the closed portion of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior. Circumstances presenting an imminent danger of damage to the State Capitol Exterior include, but are not limited to, the saturation of soil, turf, or landscaped areas with water, excessive foot traffic over landscaped areas, preventing turf or plants from obtaining adequate sunlight, and the buildup of ice or snow on landscaped areas. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T

300. RESTRICTIONS AND LIMITATIONS ON USE.

301. USES INTERFERING WITH ACCESS OR USE OF FACILITY.

01. **Interference With Primary Use of Idaho State Capitol Exterior.** Events, ~~e~~Exhibits, and Public Use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior shall not interfere with the primary use of the Idaho State Capitol ~~or the adjacent real property and improvements~~. The primary uses of the Idaho State Capitol ~~includes, but is not limited to, are legislative proceedings, public meetings and hearings, court proceedings, and~~ the conduct of public business by agencies or officials of the state of Idaho that normally occupy and use the Idaho State Capitol ~~or the State Capitol Exterior~~. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T

02. **Interference With Access.** Public Use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior shall not block fire hydrants, fire or emergency vehicle lanes, vehicular drives, pedestrian walkways, doorways, steps or similar access routes through, in or out of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T

302. LOCATIONS AND HOURS.

01. **Interior Hours.** The hours for Public Use and public access to the Interior shall include the periods in which public meetings and other activities open to the public are held within the Interior. The hours for Public Use will be posted, where feasible, to the website containing official Idaho State Capitol information. Participants in Public Use of the Interior shall exit the Interior at the conclusion of the hours for Public Use. Public hours shall not be reduced during Public Use authorized under these rules unless an emergency or threat exists under Section 315 of these rules. (1-7-21)T

304. MOTORIZED VEHICLES.

Motorized vehicles not owned or operated by the state of Idaho or ~~L~~aw ~~e~~Enforcement must remain on designated roadways and parking areas. Wheelchairs, motorized scooters, and other equipment providing individual mobility to ~~the disabled individuals with a disability~~ are not motorized vehicles for the purposes of this section. ~~(3-27-13)(1-7-21)T~~

305. BICYCLES, SKATES, SKATEBOARDS, SCOOTERS, AND OTHER NON-MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION.

Bicycles, skates, skateboards, and scooters may not be used ~~on~~ at the ~~Idaho~~ State Capitol ~~Exterior~~. Users of all other non-motorized transportation must remain on designated pathways during use ~~of the Exterior~~. Where indicated by a posted notice or where requested by Security Personnel, ~~L~~aw ~~e~~Enforcement or a state employee or agent supervising the ~~Idaho~~ State Capitol ~~Exterior~~, users must store non-motorized transportation in a designated storage area on the ~~State Capitol~~ Exterior. 306. ANIMALS.

The following shall apply to animals on the ~~Idaho~~ State Capitol ~~Exterior~~:

307. LANDSCAPING AND IMPROVEMENTS.

No person other than state employees or contractors designated by the Director shall:

04. **Landscaping Materials.** Move or alter landscaping materials on the *State Capitol* Exterior including, but not limited to, rock, edging materials, and bark or mulch. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

05. **Climbing.** Climb or scale buildings, Commemorative Installations, trees, fences, posts or other improvements ~~on~~ at the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior*. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

308. FOOD AND BEVERAGES.

Consumption of food and beverages ~~on~~ at the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior* is subject to the following: ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

01. **Consumption May Be Prohibited.** The consumption of food and beverages, including water, may be prohibited by a notice posted at the entrance to all or a portion of the *State Capitol* Exterior. Each authority granted control of a portion of the Interior as described in Section 67-1602, Idaho Code, may prohibit the consumption of food and beverages, including water, in that portion of the Interior by posting a notice at one (1) or more of the entrances to the portion of the Interior under its control. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

02. **Alcohol.** Alcohol may not be consumed or distributed on the *State Capitol* Exterior or the Public Space. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

309. SMOKING AND VAPING.

All persons shall observe the smoke free entrance notices and shall smoke or vape only in designated areas of the *State Capitol* Exterior. Smoking and vaping is not allowed in the Interior ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

310. FIRES, CANDLES, AND FLAMES.

No fires, candles or other sources of open flame are permitted ~~on~~ at the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior*. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

311. POSTERS, PLACARDS, BANNERS, SIGNS, EQUIPMENT, TABLES, MATERIALS, AND DISPLAYS.

01. **Electrical Cords.** Electrical cords must be protected by cord covers or gaffers tape to prevent an electrical or trip hazard. (3-27-13)

02. **Railings.** No items may be placed on railings and no persons shall sit or stand on railings. (3-27-13)

03. **Tossing or Dropping Items.** No items may be tossed or dropped over railings or from one (1) level of the Idaho State Capitol or improvements on the grounds of at the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior* to another level or to the ground. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

04. **Ingress or Egress.** No item, including tables, chairs, exhibits, equipment, materials, and displays shall be located so as to block ingress or egress to any portion of the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior*, or to restrict the follow flow of individuals using the facility, or to restrict emergency egress or ingress. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

05. **Attaching, Affixing, Leaning or Propping Materials.** Posters, placards, banners, signs, and dDisplays, including any printed materials, shall not be affixed on any *exterior* surface of the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior* or on any permanent Exhibit or Commemorative Installation, post, railing, fence or landscaping, including trees. All posters, placards, banners, signs, and dDisplays must be free-standing or supported by individuals. No items may be leaned or propped against any *exterior* surface of the Idaho State Capitol *Exterior* or embedded into the ground including, but not limited to, placement of a stake, post or rod into the ground to support materials. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

06. **Materials Causing Damage to Surfaces.** Stages, risers, chairs, tables, sound equipment, props,

materials, displays, and similar items shall be constructed and used in a manner that will not damage, scratch, dent, dig or tear any surface on the Idaho State Capitol Exterior or any systems or utilities of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior including, but not limited to, fire suppression systems, storm drains, ventilation systems, and landscape watering systems. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

07. Free Distribution of Literature and Printed Material. All literature and printed material must be distributed at no charge. The party distributing literature and printed material shall ensure periodically and at the conclusion of its use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior that such material is not discarded outside of designated trash receptacles. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

08. Surface Markings. Users shall not use any material to mark on any surface of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior including chalk, paint, pens, ink, or dye. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

09. Capacity. The number of users in the Interior is limited to the capacity designated by health and safety officials including, but not limited to, the state fire marshal, the division of building safety, and the department of health and welfare. (1-7-21)T

10. Moving Furniture and Items. The public shall not move furnishings owned by the state of Idaho or placed by agents or employees of the state of Idaho at the Idaho State Capitol, including chairs, benches, tables, signs, art, memorials, statues, or Exhibits. (1-7-21)T

11. Sound Amplification. Except for amplification provided by the Department under a Permit and use by Law Enforcement or Security Personnel or by state employees and officials under Subsection 315.01 of these rules, sound amplification devices shall not be used in the Interior. (1-7-21)T

312. ITEMS SUBJECT TO SEARCH.

To enhance security and public safety, Security Personnel and ~~L~~aw ~~e~~Enforcement may inspect: ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

01. Packages and Bags. Packages, backpacks, purses, bags, and briefcases reasonably suspected of concealing stolen items or items prohibited by law, including these rules. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

02. Items. Items brought ~~on~~to the Idaho State Capitol Exterior, if there is a reasonable suspicion that an item may be capable of injuring, damaging or harming persons or property ~~on~~ at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior of disrupting the primary uses of the Idaho State Capitol in violation of law, including these rules. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

313. PROHIBITED ITEMS.

The following, as defined in ~~T~~itle 18, ~~C~~hapter 33, Idaho Code, are not permitted at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior: bombs, destructive devices, shrapnel, weapons of mass destruction, biological weapons, and chemical weapons. Security Personnel or ~~L~~aw ~~e~~Enforcement may direct that any person at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior immediately remove from the Idaho State Capitol Exterior any club, bat, or other item that can be used in violation of law, including these rules, to injure, damage, or harm persons or property or to disrupt the primary uses of the Interior. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T

314. UTILITY SERVICE.

The public may not use the utility services of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior other than restrooms and drinking fountains; provided, however, the Director may authorize limited use of electrical service for the duration of Public Use authorized by these rules. Utility services include, but are not limited to, electrical, sewage, water, heating, and geothermal services. The Director may terminate the use of utilities if such use interferes with the utility services of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior or the equipment or apparatus using utility service fails to comply with applicable rules or codes. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T

315. LAW ENFORCEMENT AND FACILITY EXIGENCY – REMOVAL FOR NON-COMPLIANCE.

01. Emergency or Threat. In case of a fire, bomb threat, utility malfunction, structural failure or other unforeseen emergency or threat endangering public safety or health, or endangering public property, ~~L~~aw ~~e~~Enforcement, ~~s~~Security ~~p~~Personnel and state employees or officials may direct all persons off of or out of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior and delay or postpone any activity until the emergency or threat is abated. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T

02. Removal. The Director, the Presiding Officer, or their designees are authorized to request that Law Enforcement remove or exclude any person from the Interior who engages in any of the following: (1-7-21)T

a. Violation of law, including these rules, where such violation: (1-7-21)T

i. Interferes with the primary uses of the Idaho State Capitol, injures persons or property, or is likely to injure persons or property, or, (1-7-21)T

ii. Law Enforcement, Security Personnel, the Presiding officer, or the Director or his designee has requested compliance with the applicable law, including provisions of these rules, and the person has refused to comply. (1-7-21)T

b. Engaging in a riot, unlawful gathering or a gathering designed to impede the business of the state of Idaho in violation of Sections 18-6401 or 18-6404, Idaho Code. (1-7-21)T

316. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW.

All use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior shall comply with applicable law including, but not limited to, fire, health, and safety codes. (3-27-13)(1-7-21)T

317. HEALTH, SAFETY AND MAINTENANCE OF STATE FACILITIES.

01. Clean Condition After Use. Users shall leave the Idaho State Capitol Exterior in reasonably clean condition after use, including depositing all trash in designated receptacles. (3-27-13)(1-7-21)T

02. Return of Items Return to Proper Location. Users shall return all items including, but not limited to, movable furniture and trash receptacles, to their location at the conclusion of the event or exhibit use. (3-18-14)(1-7-21)T

03. Public Health. No person shall excrete human waste at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior except in designated restroom facilities. For purposes of this section, excrete means the discharge of human waste from the body, including the acts of defecation and urination. For purposes of this section, human waste means human feces or human urine. (3-27-13)(1-7-21)T

04. Fireworks. No person shall possess or use fireworks on at the Idaho State Capitol Exterior. (3-27-13)(1-7-21)T

05. Attire. Persons in the Interior shall be fully clothed. Fully clothed means wearing shoes and one (1) or more garments extending from the wearer's shoulders to the wearer's legs. (1-7-21)T

318. -- 399. (RESERVED)

400. PERMITS.

01. Use Without a Permit. A Permit grants a reservation providing priority for use of the area specified in the Permit as set forth in Subsection 200.04 of these rules. Applicants desiring to obtain a Permit for use of the State Capitol Exterior or the Public Space outside of the Permit areas, hours or duration or who have not submitted an application within the application period may use the State Capitol Exterior or the Public Space, subject to the provisions of these rules, on a first-come, first used basis. Permits will be issued to groups of two (2) or more people. (3-18-14)(1-7-21)T

02. Permit Areas, Hours and Duration, and Number of Participants. (3-18-14)

a. The Director will consider and grant Permits only for: (1-7-21)T

i. Public Use of the Jefferson Street Steps; and (1-7-21)T

- ii. Public Use of the Public Space on the second floor rotunda. ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T
 - b. The Director will issue Permits for the following periods: (1-7-21)T
 - ~~i. Reserving use of the Jefferson Street Steps only for the period between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on State Business Days; and~~ ~~(3-18-14)~~(1-7-21)T
 - ii. Reserving the Public Space on the second floor rotunda during the hours of use in Section 302 of these rules. (1-7-21)T
 - c. The duration of a Permit for the Jefferson Street Steps will not exceed four (4) consecutive hours. The duration of a Permit for the Public Space will not exceed eight (8) consecutive hours. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T
 - d. The Director will issue a Permit only for Public Use involving two (2) or more persons. (3-18-14)
 - 03. Application Period.** Permit applications must be received and complete at least two (2) State Business Days prior to the requested date and time period of the Permit. The Department will not accept applications submitted more than six (6) months prior to the requested date of the Permit. (3-18-14)
 - 04. Validity.** Permits are valid only for the dates, times, and locations specified on the Permit as approved by the Director. (3-27-13)
 - 05. Distribution.** Permits shall be granted by the Director on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to Subsection 200.03 of these rules. Only one (1) Permit will be granted for the Jefferson Street Steps or the Public Space during any period of time. ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T
 - 06. Application Requirements.** Applications for a Permit shall be in writing on a form prescribed by the Director and available at the office of the Division of Public Works and the Department's website. The Director will only process applications that are complete and signed by the individual making a request or an authorized representative of the entity or organization making the request. The Director may make reasonable inquiry to confirm the accuracy of the application and the authority of the party signing the application. (3-27-13)

 - 08. Transferability.** Permits are non-transferable. (3-27-13)
- 401. APPROVALS AND DENIALS OF A PERMIT APPLICATION.**
- 01. Period for Approval or Denial.** The Department will approve or deny a complete application within two (2) State Business Days of the submission of the application. (3-18-14)
 - 02. Basis for Denial.** Permits may be denied for one (1) or more of the following: (3-27-13)
 - a. A Permit has been granted for all or part of the requested location during all or part of the requested time period. (3-27-13)
 - b. A public entity or official will be using all or part of the requested location during all or part of the requested time period. (3-27-13)
 - c. The requested use would violate any provision of these rules or applicable law. (3-27-13)
 - d. These rules do not authorize the use for the location or times requested or do not authorize the issuance of a Permit for the location requested. (3-27-13)
 - e. The Permit application is incomplete, contains a material falsehood, or contains a material

- misrepresentation. (3-27-13)
- f. The Permit applicant has not certified that the applicant will comply with these rules or applicable law. (3-27-13)
- g. The party signing the application is not legally competent to bind themselves or the organization or entity submitting the application. (3-27-13)
- h. The individual, organization or entity submitting the application: (3-27-13)
- i. Failed to pay costs or damages arising from an earlier use of any state facility; (3-27-13)
- ii. Made a material misrepresentation regarding the nature or scope of the use on a prior Permit application; (3-27-13)
- iii. Violated the terms of prior Permits issued to the individual, organization or entity; or (3-27-13)
- iv. Violated any applicable law in the course of previous Public Use of state of Idaho facilities. (3-18-14)
- i. The requested use would cause a clear and present danger to the orderly processes of state of Idaho government or to the use of the Idaho State Capitol Exterior due to advocacy of: ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T
- i. The violent overthrow of the government of the United States, the state of Idaho, or any political subdivision thereof; (3-27-13)
- ii. The willful damage or destruction, or seizure and subversion of public property; (3-27-13)
- iii. The forcible disruption or impairment of or interference with the regularly scheduled functions of the state of Idaho; ~~(3-27-13)~~(1-7-21)T
- iv. The physical harm, coercion, intimidation or other invasions of the lawful rights of public officials or the public; or (3-27-13)
- v. Other disorders of a violent nature. (3-27-13)

402. REVOCATION OF A PERMIT.

A Permit may be revoked by the Director for the violation of any term or condition of the Permit or the violation of law including, but not limited to, the violation of any provision of these rules. (3-27-13)

403. APPEALS.

01. Time for Appeal. The individual or the organization or entity submitting an application may request that the Department initiate a contested case within the period set forth below. The Department will not initiate a contested case after the following periods: (3-27-13)
