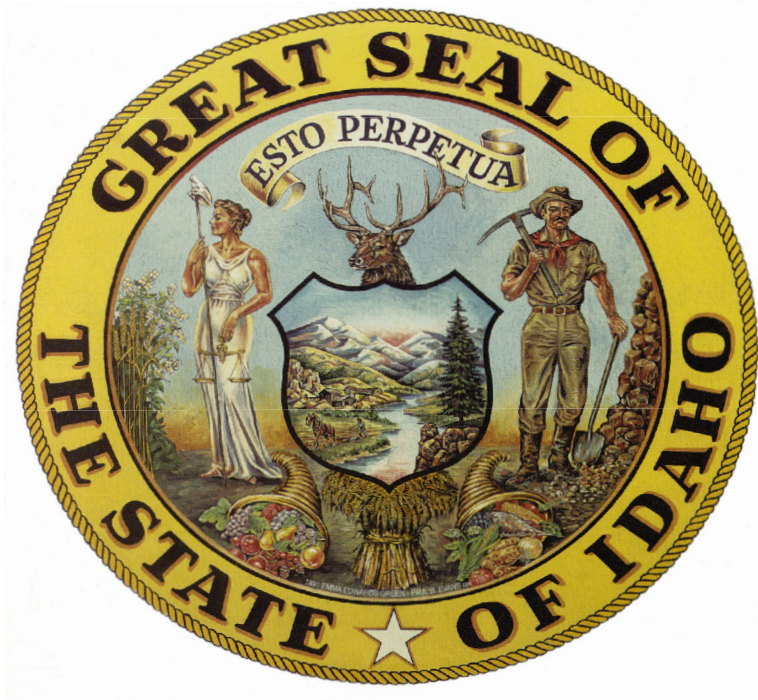

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PREFACE

The Idaho Administrative Bulletin is an electronic-only, online monthly publication of the Office of the Administrative Rules Coordinator, Division of Financial Management, that is published pursuant to Section 67-5203, Idaho Code. The Bulletin is a compilation of all official rulemaking notices, official rule text, executive orders of the Governor, and all legislative documents affecting rules that are statutorily required to be published in the Bulletin. It may also include other rules-related documents an agency may want to make public through the Bulletin.

State agencies are required to provide public notice of all rulemaking actions and must invite public input. This is done through negotiated rulemaking procedures or after proposed rulemaking has been initiated. The public receives notice that an agency has initiated proposed rulemaking procedures through the Idaho Administrative Bulletin and a legal notice (Public Notice of Intent) that publishes in authorized newspapers throughout the state. The legal notice provides reasonable opportunity for the public to participate when a proposed rule publishes in the Bulletin. Interested parties may submit written comments to the agency or request public hearings of the agency, if none have been scheduled. Such submissions or requests must be presented to the agency within the time and manner specified in the individual “Notice of Rulemaking - Proposed Rule” for each proposed rule that is published in the Bulletin.

Once the comment period closes, the agency considers fully all comments and information submitted regarding the proposed rule. Changes may be made to the proposed rule at this stage of the rulemaking, but changes must be based on comments received and must be a “logical outgrowth” of the proposed rule. The agency may now adopt and publish the pending rule. A pending rule is “pending” legislative review for final approval. The pending rule is the agency’s final version of the rulemaking that will be forwarded to the legislature for review and final approval. Comment periods and public hearings are not provided for when the agency adopts a temporary or pending rule.

CITATION TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

The Bulletin is identified by the calendar year and issue number. For example, Bulletin 22-1 refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year 2022; Bulletin 24-1 refers to the first Bulletin issued in calendar year 2024. Volume numbers, which proceed from 1 to 12 in a given year, correspond to the months of publication, i.e.; Volume No. 22-1 refers to January 2022; Volume No. 24-2 refers to February 2024; and so forth. Example: The Bulletin published in January 2022 is cited as Volume 22-1. The December 2022 Bulletin is cited as Volume 22-12.

RELATIONSHIP TO THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

The **Idaho Administrative Code** is an electronic-only, online compilation of all final and enforceable administrative rules of the state of Idaho that are of full force and effect. Any temporary rule that is adopted by an agency and is of force and effect is codified into the Administrative Code upon Bulletin publication. All pending rules that have been approved by the legislature during the legislative session as final rules and any temporary rules that are extended supplement the Administrative Code. These rules are codified into the Administrative Code upon becoming effective. Because proposed and pending rules are not enforceable, they are published in the Administrative Bulletin only and cannot be codified into the Administrative Code until approved as final.

THE DIFFERENT RULES PUBLISHED IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Idaho’s administrative rulemaking process, governed by the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act, [Title 67, Chapter 52, Idaho Code](#), comprises distinct rulemaking actions: negotiated, proposed, temporary, pending, and final rulemaking. Not all rulemakings incorporate or require all of these actions. For a rule to become final, at a minimum, a rulemaking includes proposed, pending, and final rulemaking. Some rules may be adopted as temporary rules when they meet the required statutory criteria. Agencies must, when feasible, engage in negotiated rulemaking at the beginning of the process to facilitate consensus building. In some cases, the process may begin with proposed rulemaking and end with the final rulemaking. The following is a brief explanation of each type of rule.

1. NEGOTIATED RULEMAKING

Negotiated rulemaking is a process in which all interested persons and the agency seek consensus on the content of a rule through dialogue. Agencies are required to conduct negotiated rulemaking whenever it is feasible to do so. The agency files a “Notice of Intent to Promulgate – Negotiated Rulemaking” for publication in the Administrative Bulletin inviting interested persons to contact the agency if interested in discussing the agency’s intentions regarding the rule changes. This process is intended to result in the formulation of a proposed rule and the initiation of regular rulemaking procedures. One result, however, may also be that regular (proposed) rulemaking is not initiated and no further action is taken by the agency.

2. PROPOSED RULEMAKING

A proposed rulemaking is an action by an agency wherein the agency is proposing to amend or repeal an existing rule or to adopt a new rule. Prior to the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, the agency must publish a “Notice of Rulemaking – Proposed Rule” in the Bulletin. This notice must include very specific information regarding the rulemaking including all relevant state or federal statutory authority occasioning the rulemaking, a non-technical description of the changes being made, any associated costs, guidance on how to participate through submission of written comments and requests for public hearings, and the text of the proposed rule in legislative format.

3. TEMPORARY RULEMAKING

Temporary rules may be adopted only when the governor finds that it is necessary for:

- a) protection of the public health, safety, or welfare; or
- b) compliance with deadlines in amendments to governing law or federal programs; or
- c) reducing a regulatory burden that would otherwise impact individuals or businesses.

If a rulemaking meets one or more of these criteria, and with the Governor’s approval, the agency may adopt and make a temporary rule effective prior to receiving legislative authorization and without allowing for any public input. The law allows an agency to make a temporary rule immediately effective upon adoption. A temporary rule expires at the conclusion of the next succeeding regular legislative session unless the rule is extended by concurrent resolution, is replaced by a final rule, or expires under its own terms.

4. PENDING RULEMAKING

A pending rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under regular rulemaking procedures and remains subject to legislative review before it becomes a final, enforceable rule. When a pending rule is published in the Bulletin, the agency is required to include certain information in the “Notice of Rulemaking – Pending Rule.” This includes a statement giving the reasons for adopting the rule, a statement regarding when the rule becomes effective, a description of how it differs from the proposed rule, and identification of any fees being imposed or changed.

Agencies are required to republish the text of the pending rule when substantive changes have been made to the proposed rule. An agency may adopt a pending rule that varies in content from that which was originally proposed if the subject matter of the rule remains the same, the pending rule change is a logical outgrowth of the proposed rule, and the original notice was written so as to assure that members of the public were reasonably notified of the subject. It is not always necessary to republish all the text of the pending rule.

5. FINAL RULEMAKING

A final rule is a rule that has been adopted by an agency under the regular rulemaking procedures and is of full force and effect.

HOW TO USE THE IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE BULLETIN

Rulemaking documents produced by state agencies and published in the **Idaho Administrative Bulletin** are organized by a numbering schematic. Each state agency has a two-digit identification code number known as the “**IDAPA**” number. (The “IDAPA” Codes are listed in the alphabetical/numerical index at the end of this Preface.) Within each agency there are divisions or sections to which a two-digit “TITLE” number is assigned. There are “CHAPTER” numbers assigned within the Title and the rule text is divided among major sections that are further subdivided into subsections. An example IDAPA number is as follows:

IDAPA 38.05.01.041.02.c.ii.

“**IDAPA**” refers to Administrative Rules in general that are subject to the Administrative Procedures Act and are required by this act to be published in the Idaho Administrative Code and the Idaho Administrative Bulletin.

“**38.**” refers to the Idaho Department of Administration

“**05.**” refers to Title **05**, which is the Department of Administration’s Division of Purchasing

“**01.**” refers to Chapter **01** of Title 05, “Rules of the Division of Purchasing”

“**041.**” refers to Major Section **041**, “Acquisition Procedures”

“**02.**” refers to Subsection 041.02.

“**c.**” refers to Subsection 041.02.c.

“**ii.**” refers to Subsection 041.02.c.ii.

DOCKET NUMBERING SYSTEM

Internally, the Bulletin is organized sequentially using a rule docketing system. Each rulemaking that is filed with the Coordinator is assigned a “DOCKET NUMBER.” The docket number is a series of numbers separated by a hyphen “-”, (**38-0501-2201**). Rulemaking dockets are published sequentially by IDAPA number (the two-digit agency code) in the Bulletin. The following example is a breakdown of a typical rule docket number:

“DOCKET NO. 38-0501-2201”

“**38-**” denotes the agency’s **IDAPA** number; in this case the Department of Administration.

“**0501-**” refers to the **TITLE AND CHAPTER** numbers of the agency rule being promulgated; in this case the Division of Purchasing (**TITLE 05**), Rules of the Division of Purchasing (**Chapter 01**).

“**2201**” denotes the year and sequential order of the docket being published; in this case the numbers refer to the first rulemaking action published in **calendar year 2022**. A subsequent rulemaking on this same rule chapter in calendar year 2022 would be designated as “**2202**”. The docket number in this scenario would be 38-0501-**2202**.

Within each Docket, only the affected sections of chapters are printed. (See **Sections Affected Index** in each Bulletin for a listing of these.) The individual sections affected are printed in the Bulletin sequentially (e.g. Section “200” appears before Section “345” and so on). Whenever the sequence of the numbering is broken the following statement will appear:

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF PROCLAMATION FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2025

AUTHORITY: As authorized by Section 36-104, Idaho Code, and in compliance with Sections 36-105(3), Idaho Code, the Commission adopts proclamations establishing seasons and limits for hunting, fishing, and trapping in Idaho.

AVAILABILITY OF OFFICIAL PROCLAMATIONS: Hunters, anglers, and trappers are advised to consult the text of the Commission’s official proclamation before hunting, fishing, or trapping. Current versions of Commission proclamations are available on-line at <https://idfg.idaho.gov/rules>, with print versions available at Idaho Department of Fish and Game offices and license vendors.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY AND PUBLIC MEETING SCHEDULE: The Commission meeting schedule and meeting agendas are available on-line at <https://idfg.idaho.gov/about/commission/schedule>, with opportunities for public comment generally scheduled at its January, March, May, July, and November meetings.

Current/scheduled proclamations of the Commission include:

- **Big Game:** elk, deer (mule and white-tailed), mountain lion, black bear, pronghorn, gray wolf

The proclamation adopted by the Commission for the 2024-2025 big game hunting seasons includes black bear seasons through July 2025 and gray wolf and mountain lion seasons through June 2025.

2025-2026 season setting is scheduled for Commission action at its quarterly meeting on March 26, 2025 (public hearing March 25, 2025).

- **Big Game:** moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat (once-in-a-lifetime big game species)

2025-2026 seasons were set at the Commission’s quarterly meeting on January 29, 2025 (public hearing January 28, 2025).

- **Migratory Game Birds**

The proclamation adopted by the Commission for 2024-2025 seasons include waterfowl seasons through March 2025.

2025-2026 season setting is scheduled for Commission action on a conference call in April.

- **Upland Game, Furbearer, Falconry, Upland (non-migratory) Game Birds:** turkey, pheasant, grouse (except sage grouse), quail, partridge

The proclamation adopted by the Commission for 2024-25 includes upland game bird seasons through January 2026, upland game animal and falconry seasons through March 2026, and furbearer seasons through June 2026.

- **Sage Grouse**

2025 season setting is scheduled for Commission Action on July 17, 2025 (public hearing July 16, 2025).

- **Fishing** (except for spring/summer chinook salmon)

The proclamation adopted for 2025-2027 seasons includes fishing seasons (except for spring/summer chinook salmon) through December 31, 2027.

- **Spring/summer Chinook Salmon**

Spring/summer chinook salmon season setting is scheduled for Commission action on March 26, 2025 (public hearing March 25, 2025).

- **Peregrine Falcon Capture** (for falconry use)

The 2025-2027 season setting for peregrine capture is scheduled for the quarterly Commission meeting on March 26, 2025 (public hearing March 25, 2025).

As provided in Sections 36-104 and 36-105, Idaho Code, the Commission retains authority to issue proclamations for additional species, amend existing proclamations, and adjust the above schedule as circumstances warrant. As provided in Section 36-106, Idaho Code, the Director has authority to close seasons or reduce bag or possession limits as circumstances may warrant and to open seasons to protect property from wildlife damage or for salvage.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2025-01

GONE WITH THE LAVA RIDGE WIND PROJECT ACT

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State of Idaho to lead on reliable, affordable, sustainable, and innovative energy strategies that responsibly enhance Idahoans' quality of life and the state's economy; and

WHEREAS, this responsibility requires public lands to be managed with a long-term view for multiple and mixed uses, conservation of valued natural, historical and cultural resources, and support from the local communities; and

WHEREAS, the unprecedented proposed Lava Ridge Wind Project (project) would install up to 241 wind turbines, each reaching heights of up to 660 feet, spanning over 100,000 acres in Jerome, Lincoln, and Minidoka counties in Idaho; and

WHEREAS, this project has faced overwhelming opposition from Idaho residents and elected officials over its permanent impact on multiple use, cultural and historical sites, including the Minidoka National Historic Site, wildlife, and local economies; and

WHEREAS, significant concerns related to the proposed project have not been addressed, specifically related to the February 6, 2023, letter addressed to then Idaho State BLM Director Karen Kelleher and signed by Governor Little, Lt. Governor Scott Bedke, U.S. Senator Mike Crapo, U.S. Senator Jim Risch, and Congressman Mike Simpson; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2024 Interior and Environment Appropriations bill contained language that was signed into law which directed federal agencies to work with local stakeholders to address concerns about the project, and to date that consultation has not been adequately completed; and

WHEREAS, despite significant negative impacts, statewide opposition, and specific federal legislation and law, the Biden Administration blindly pushed its unsound energy agenda by exploiting Idaho resources for California's benefit; and

WHEREAS, on January 20, 2025, President Donald J. Trump signed an executive order temporarily halting the Lava Ridge Wind Project and mandating a review of the Record of Decision and comprehensive analysis by the Secretary of the Interior to assess various interests implicated by the project and the environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, Idaho has demanded such a comprehensive analysis for years and stands ready to advance the President's order; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this state, do hereby order as follows:

- 1. State Agency Cooperation: All state agencies are directed to fully cooperate with the review process initiated by President Trump's executive order, providing necessary data and support to ensure a thorough assessment of the Lava Ridge Wind Project's impacts.*
- 2. Public Engagement: In collaboration with local governments, Idaho state agencies shall participate in public forums to gather input from Idaho residents, ensuring that their concerns and perspectives are adequately represented in the review process.*

This order is effective immediately.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2025-02

IDAHO STRATEGIC PERMITTING, EFFICIENCY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (SPEED) ACT

WHEREAS, the State of Idaho is the least regulated state in the nation and remains committed to fostering an environment that supports economic growth and promotes responsible development across all sectors; and

WHEREAS, a transparent and streamlined regulatory process is critical to improving the efficiency of permitting and approval timelines, which will facilitate transformative projects, create jobs, and enhance the overall economic vitality of Idaho and the quality of life of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, it is essential to improve collaboration between government agencies, project proponents, stakeholders, and communities to achieve transparent, effective, and well-informed decisions that balance growth with environmental and safety considerations; and

WHEREAS, identifying areas of improvement within Idaho's regulatory framework and incorporating best practices will lead to a more effective and responsive government.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of Idaho, do hereby order:

- 1. The Idaho Strategic Permitting, Efficiency and Economic Development Council (the "Council") is hereby established to support the state's goals of permitting efficiency, transparency and reform.*
- 2. The responsibilities of the Council shall be to:*
 - a. Improve early consultation between Idaho's permitting agencies and project proponents;*
 - b. Design, implement, and facilitate a coordinated permitting process that will improve transparency, predictability, and timeliness for certain projects;*
 - c. Promote efficiency and transparency through the publication of project-specific timetables with completion timelines for all State authorizations and environmental reviews;*
 - d. Increase accountability through consultation and reporting on projects; and*
 - e. Identify sections of statute or administrative rule that are duplicative, unnecessary, or unreasonably prolong the State's permitting process.*
- 3. The Council will be comprised of the Director or a designee with delegated authority for their respective agency, appointed by the Governor; and shall include, without limitation, the following agencies:*
 - a. Idaho Office of Energy and Mineral Resources Administrator*
 - b. Idaho Department of Environmental Quality*
 - c. Idaho Department of Lands*
 - d. Idaho Department of Water Resources*
 - e. Idaho Department of Agriculture*
 - f. Idaho Office of Emergency Management*
 - g. Idaho State Historical Preservation Office*
- 4. The Council shall be chaired by the Administrator of the Office of Energy and Mineral Resources.*
- 5. The Chair may add or remove members of the Council with the consent of the Governor.*
- 6. The Governor shall appoint an agency within the executive branch to manage the budget and staffing requirements to administer the work and needs of the Council.*

7. *The Lieutenant Governor may serve as an advisor to the Council.*
8. *The Chair, with majority consent of the Council, shall establish criteria for projects deemed eligible for review and consultation and corresponding procedures for transparent and streamlined coordination of applicable approval processing.*
9. *The Council may enter into and make voluntary contracts and agreements with public agencies, municipal corporations, and private parties for funding or reimbursement of staff and consultant costs.*
 - a. *Agreements shall be limited to a four (4) year term, with the option to renew upon agreement of all parties.*
 - b. *Moneys received through these contracts and agreements shall be expended pursuant to appropriation.*
3. *State Agencies may seek legislative appropriation for additional resources and administrative support to assist in the completion of the Council's mission.*
4. *The Council shall prepare an annual report to the Governor detailing the work of the Council; identifying best practices; and, if appropriate, recommending changes to policy, statutory, and regulatory provisions or processes to achieve the goals and purposes of this Act.*
5. *The duties, responsibilities, and authority of this Executive Order shall not alter any existing authorities of state agencies established by state law. Nothing in this Executive Order shall be construed to provide or imply any regulatory authority by the Council over activities that are subject to the jurisdiction of another state agency.*

CUMULATIVE RULEMAKING INDEX OF IDAHO ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

This index provides a history of all agency rulemakings beginning with the first Administrative Bulletin in July 1993 to the most recent Bulletin publication.
