IDAPA 19.01.01 - Rules Pertaining To The Idaho State Board of Dentistry (Docket No. 19-0101-1301)

The Idaho State Board of Dentistry submits notice of proposed rulemaking at IDAPA 19.01.01 - Rules Pertaining To The Idaho State Board of Dentistry. The Board states that this rulemaking reflects and clarifies current practice standards, reduces the application fee for dentists by credentials and performs general house-keeping duties. Specifically, this rulemaking accomplishes the following:

- (1) Clarifies that a dental hygienist is prohibited from taking any type of final impression;
- (2) Clarifies the prohibited duties for a dental assistant and adds the use of an air polisher to the list of prohibited duties;
- (3) Adds failure to release patient records and failure to cooperate with authorities to the rules of unprofessional conduct;
- (4) Revises advertising rules;
- (5) Reduces the hours of continuing education needed for renewal of an extended access dental hygiene license endorsement from twelve to four;
- (6) Requires a dentist to maintain certification in basic life support for health care providers for renewal of a moderate enteral sedation permit; and
- (7) Requires advanced cardiac life support certification for renewal of a moderate parenteral sedation permit.

The Board states that negotiated rulemaking was conducted and that a Notice of Intent to Promulgate Rules was published in the July edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin. This rule incorporates by reference the latest edition of The American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, Office Anesthesia Evaluation Manual. The Board states that this rulemaking will negatively impact the Board's dedicated fund by approximately \$4,800 per fiscal year.

The proposed rule appears to be within the statutory authority granted to the Board in Section 54-912, Idaho Code.
