SUBJECT: Bureau of Occupational Licenses - State Board of Podiatry

IDAPA 24.11.01 - Rules of the State Board of Podiatry (**Fee Rule**) - Proposed Rule (Docket No. 24-1101-1401)

The Bureau of Occupational Licenses submits notice of proposed fee rulemaking on behalf of the State Board of Podiatry. The proposed rule establishes requirements for inactive license status and an inactive license fee of \$250.

The Bureau's cost/benefit analysis states that the impact of the proposed fee rule on the dedicated fund will depend on the number of licensees who choose to convert active licenses to inactive licenses or choose an inactive license instead of not renewing.

Negotiated rulemaking was not conducted because the rule was prompted by and is consistent with House Bill 356 passed during the 2014 legislative session. No opposition to the proposed fee rule is anticipated.

The Board's proposed fee rule is authorized by Section 54-605, Idaho Code.
