SUBJECT: Bureau of Occupational Licenses - Board of Examiners of Residential Care Facility Administrators

IDAPA 24.19.01 - Rules Pertaining To The Board of Examiners of Residential Care Facility Administrators (Fee Rule) - Proposed Rule (Docket No. 24-1901-1401)

The Board of Examiners of Residential Care Facility Administrators submits notice of proposed rulemaking at IDAPA 24.19.01. The proposed rule increases application, license, and license renewal fees from \$100 to \$150. The purpose of the rule is to increase revenues to meet expenses.

The rule has no negative impact on the state general fund. Negotiated rulemaking was not conducted; however, the fee increase was discussed during a noticed, open meeting of the Board. The rule is consistent with the Board's authority under Section 54-4205, Idaho Code.

STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC IMPACT:

The rule change will result in an annual increase of approximately \$24,050.00 in the Board's dedicated fund based on the current number of licensees and an estimated number of 19 applications received last year. Fees paid by applicants and licensees will increase from \$100 to \$150 for applications, annual renewals and provisional permit fee.
