**SUBJECT:** Bureau of Occupational Licenses - State Board of Psychologist Examiners

IDAPA 24.12.01 - Rules of the State Board of Psychologist Examiners - Proposed Rule (Docket No. 24-1201-1701)

The Bureau of Occupational Licenses submits notice of proposed rulemaking relating to the Rules of the State Board of Psychologist Examiners. The proposed rule ensures that temporary licensees hold a certificate of prescriptive authority issued by the Board before they can issue a prescription. It amends the length of face-to-face supervision time required for certain service extenders, provides recordkeeping requirements and provides availability requirements for the licensed psychologist. The rule also provides for the type and method of telepsychology services that may be provided, as well as requiring telehealth providers to obtain consent of a patient upon initial contact regarding the risks of telepsychology services. The Bureau states that negotiated rulemaking was not conducted because the proposed changes were discussed during noticed, open meetings of the Board. The proposed rule appears to be within the Board's statutory authority pursuant to sections 54-2303, 54-2305 and 54-5713, Idaho Code.
