IDAPA 07.01.02 - Rules Governing Fees for Electrical Inspections (Fee Rule) - Proposed Rule (Docket No. 07-0102-1801)

Summary and Stated Reasons for the Rule

The Division of Building Safety submits notice of a proposed fee rule at IDAPA 07.01.02 - Rules Governing Fees for Electrical Inspections. This proposed fee rule updates the terminology and procedures used for electrical permits with those currently being used. The proposed updates are also to align the rule with recent statutory changes. The proposed fee rule also adds a fee of forty-five dollars (\$45) for transferring electrical permits.

Negotiated Rulemaking / Fiscal Impact

The Division states that negotiated rulemaking was conducted and that notice was published in the July edition of the Idaho Administrative Bulletin. There is no fiscal impact associated with this rulemaking.

Statutory Authority

The proposed fee rule appears to be within the statutory authority granted to the Division in Sections 54-1005 and 54-1006, Idaho Code.

STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC IMPACT:

The proposed rule imposes a fee for transferring an electrical permit. This rule will have no fiscal impact on the state general fund. The Division of Building Safety does not expect the fee itself to have any impact on the Electrical Board fund because the fee only covers the administrative costs of processing the transfer of an electrical permit to a new permit holder. The actual rule will have a negligible negative fiscal impact on the Electrical Board fund. The Division currently retains fees for permits that cannot be transferred. Further, a person who cannot receive a transferred permit must instead purchase a whole new permit. Although the rule requires a person transferring a permit to pay a one-time fee of forty-five dollars (\$45), that fee is significantly less expensive than the price of an entirely new electrical permit.
