IDAPA 07 TITLE 01 Chapter 07

07.01.07 - RULES GOVERNING CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL SERVICES

000. LEGAL AUTHORITY.

The Idaho Electrical Board is authorized under Sections 54-1003 and 54-1006(5), Idaho Code, to adopt rules concerning the continuing education requirements for journeyman and master journeyman licensing. (2-26-93)

001. TITLE AND SCOPE.

These rules shall be cited as IDAPA 07, Title 1, Chapter 7, Rules Governing Continuing Education Requirements, Division of Building Safety. These rules include criteria for requirements for continuing education for electrical licensees. (2-26-93)

002. WRITTEN INTERPRETATIONS.

003. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS.

The Attorney General's Idaho Rules of Administrative Procedure govern license revocation/suspension proceedings. (2-26-93)

011. CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS.

Journeymen and Master Journeymen Electricians must complete at least sixteen (16) hours of continuing education instruction in every three (3) year period between updates of the National Electrical Code. Such instruction will consist of eight (8) hours of code update instructions approved by the Electrical Bureau each code change year, and eight (8) additional hours of other approved industry related instruction in such three (3) year period. The Electrical Board will establish criteria for approval of instruction and instructors. Proof of completion of these continuing education requirements must be submitted to the Bureau with the application for license renewal by any such licensee. Failure to submit the required proof will constitute grounds for license suspension, which suspension shall continue until such proof has been submitted. These continuing education requirements shall not apply to specialty electricians.
