59.01.04 - DISABILITY RULES FOR THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT SYSTEM OF IDAHO (PERSI)

Subchapter B--General Members Rule 100 through 250--Eligibility

100. DETERMINING WORKER'S COMPENSATION OFFSET (Rule 100).

To determine the offset required by Section 59-1353, Idaho Code, the annual amount payable under the provisions of any worker's compensation law which represents income benefits as defined in Section 72-102, Idaho Code, shall be converted to a monthly equivalent and deducted from the monthly retirement allowance. 101. UNUSED SICK LEAVE NOT SALARY IN DETERMINING DISABILITY RETIREMENT (Rule 101).

Unused sick leave entitlement provided for by either Section 33-1228, 33-2109A, or 67-5339, Idaho Code, shall not be considered salary or compensation in the application of Section 59-1354(1), Idaho Code. Statutory References: Cross References: (1-1-94)

300. VOLUNTARY RETIREMENT FOR DISABILITY RETIRED FIREFIGHTER (Rule 300).

A paid firefighter with disability retirement pursuant to Title 72, Chapter 14, Idaho Code, who is or becomes eligible for voluntary retirement pursuant to Title 72, Chapter 14, Idaho Code, may apply for and be granted voluntary retirement. Statutory References: Cross References: (1-1-94)

301. DETERMINING WORKER'S COMPENSATION OFFSET--FRF (Rule 301).

The worker's compensation award offset required by Section 72-1447, Idaho Code, shall be made in the manner prescribed by Section 59-1353, Idaho Code. To determine the offset required by Section 72-1447, Idaho Code, the annual amount payable under the provisions of any worker's compensation law which represents income benefits as defined in Section 72-102, Idaho Code, shall be converted to a monthly equivalent and deducted from the monthly retirement allowance. Subchapter E--Disability Retirement Rule 400 through 599--General Members

400. LUMP SUM SALARY PAYMENT--DISABILITY RETIREMENT (Rule 400).

A lump sum salary payment in excess of the usual compensation pattern made by the employer to a member approved for disability retirement shall be considered as an advance of regular salary payments for the purposes of Section 59-1354(1), Idaho Code. Contributions shall be made on such lump sum salary payments to accumulate membership service in proportion to the relation of the lump sum salary payment to the member's usual compensation pattern. For example, if the disability retired member's usual compensation pattern has been at the rate of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) per month and he/she receives a final lump sum salary payment of four thousand five hundred dollars (\$4,500) for the month of December, the member receives membership service credit for the months of December, January and February. Disability service credit accumulation will then commence beginning with the

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month of March as provided by Section 59-1302(12A), Idaho Code. In the example, the months of December, January and February will then be included in the salary base period as may be consistent with the provisions of Section 59-1302(5A), Idaho Code. 401. DISABILITY RETIREMENT ELIGIBILITY (Rule 401).

For the purposes of Sections 59-1352 and 59-1354(1), Idaho Code, eligibility for disability retirement shall be the date selected by the member. However, in no event shall this date be: earlier than the date on which the member is unable to and thereafter does not return to work on a regular basis for two (2) consecutive weeks, or later than the date on which the member ceases to accrue membership credit. 402. DEFINITION OF "BECOMES DISABLED" (Rule 402).

For the purposes of Section 59-1352, Idaho Code, "becomes disabled" means the eligibility date approved by the board based on medical evidence submitted to the board. 403. DEFINITION OF "LIKELY" (Rule 403).
